

THE CLEVER DJURGARDEN TEAM OF SWEDEN

OVE NILSSON (goalkeeper). Rated throughout Sweden as the second choice to guard the net in the important games. Has a fine sense of anticipation which has brought him much fame throughout the country. Stands just over six feet and is powerfully built.

KARL ERIK ANDERSSON (right full back). 21 years old, a refrigeration expert and youngest player on the team. Played with the club since 1943 and despite his youth is very hard and effective and very clever at heading the ball. Is an international ice hockey star and played in the Olympics. Stands 6 feet one inch and weighs 160 pounds.

GUNNAR PERSSON (left full back). 26-year-old international star who has played in many of the representative games. Is very fast and never gives up for the entire ninety minutes of the play.

BJARNE REDESTAD (right half back). One of the veteran players on the team and though only 26 years old has been playing for eleven years. Is captain of the squad.

CARL JOHAN TORNBORG (center half back). A 28-year-old lawyer who stands 6 feet 4 inches and weighs 185 pounds. He is captain of the team and a fine physical specimen who is very cool under fire. He has played for Sweden in the international games several times.

STIG CARLSSON (left half back). One of the hardest workers on the team, very fast and a difficult man to get past.

BENGT MEISER (outside right). A young college player who is only 23 years old. A very clever dribbler whose specialty is centering the ball to perfection from the touchline.

BIRGER STENMAN (inside right). A 22-year-old shipping clerk and, although only scaling 157 pounds, owns a terrific shot with either foot.

HANS STELIUS (center forward). The oldest member of the team at 29 but a great leader of the forward line. An individualist of the first order and famous for his rushing tactics.

NILS CEDERBORG (inside left). An engineer by trade and 22 years old. Joined the club in 1945 and is a brilliant player. He weighs only 140 pounds and is 5 feet 8 inches.

STIG NYSTROM (outside left). The fastest player in the First Division in Sweden who has been clocked at 10.8 seconds for 110 yards. He has played on the Swedish National team for the past three years.

ARNE BLOMKVIST (full back). A mechanic by trade who joined the club in 1942. A hard worker and very heady player. 27 years old, stands 5 feet 10 inches and weighs 165 pounds.

EVAN PETERSSON (half back). Has played with the team since 1944. Is a grinder and 30 years old.

STURE LARSSON (center forward). Has played for the club since 1931 and is a painter. Stands 5 feet 11 inches, weighs 156 pounds and is 29 years old.

HANS ANDERSSON. Only 19 years old who has a great future. Is an international ice hockey player and is a mechanic.

BENGT GARPE (half back). An engineer who carries 148 pounds on his 5 foot 10 inch frame.

KJELL CRONQVIST (goalkeeper). A cake baker by trade who has played with the team since 1944. Stands 5 feet 10 inches, weighs 157 pounds and is 27 years old.

BILL THOMPSON (left halfback). Born in Glasgow, Scotland. Height, 5 feet 10½ inches. Weight, 157 pounds. Four years with Sunderland. Held Tom Lawton English International centre, goalless.

ANDY DAVIE (outside right). Born in Glasgow, Scotland. Height, 5 feet 6½ inches. Weight, 140 pounds. Amazes critics by his deceptive swerve.

LEO LAFFEY (inside right). Born in Glasgow, Scotland. Height, 5 feet 10½ inches. Weight, 170 pounds. All the flashy Scottish touches.

JOHN McCUSKER (center forward). Born in Scotland. Height, 6 feet. Weight, 170 pounds. Speed, height, terrific shot with either foot.

TOM SMITH (inside left). Born in Scotland. Height, 5 feet 4 inches. Weight, 140 pounds. Mr. Tricks — fast and dangerous.

BILL STEWART (outside left). Born in Scotland. Height, 5 feet 10 inches. Weight, 158 pounds. Beautiful ball crosser and position player.

FRED FLETCHER (utility). Born in England. Height, 5 feet 11 inches. Weight 154 pounds. Very cool, ball placer, team man.

GEORGE FALCONER (utility). Born in Edinburgh. Height, 5 feet 6 inches. Weight, 140 pounds. Hustler, good inside man.

EDDIE JOHNSON (utility). Born in Glasgow, Scotland. Height, 5 feet 10 inches. Weight, 152 pounds. Good shot either foot; shines at center.

The team on the field is handled by HARRY PHILLIPS (center half), for years classed as the top man in his position in North American Soccer. Watch the positional play of the halfback line. The Officials of the Club have tried to build a team who will keep the ball on the ground and play pattern football.
