DJURGARDEN I.K.

What a finale to London Lions first-ever season at Wembley. A visit from one of Sweden's most famous clubs is an occasion in itself. That the club is Djurgarden is doubly satisfying as they were winners of The Ahearne Cup Tournament in Stockholm early this year.

It was in the Ahearne Cup—the top European Club Tournament—that Lions first met Djurgarden, losing a close match by 5 goals to 3. The Swedes went on to win the Trophy—with a record of five wins in six starts—scoring 42 goals and conceding 21. Their only loss was a 3-2 defeat by Moscow Dynamo.

For their matches here at the Empire Pool, Djurgarden are stacked with international talent. No less than 10 of their players have appeared for Sweden at either Full International; B International or Junior level. Between them they have made 250 appearances.

The party includes men who are famous for their appearances with "Tre Kronor"—the Swedish National team. Folke Bengtsson has played 66 matches while the coach, Carl-Goran Oberg has 171 internationals to his credit.

Djurgarden have brought in two guest players from Leksands, the Swedish Champions. They are Ake Danielsson and Peter Gudmundson.

We wish a warm welcome to Djurgarden and hope that this will be the first of many visits by clubs from Sweden—a country in which ice hockey is a sport of major importance.

J. F. AHEARNE

The Ahearne Cup Tournament mentioned above is named after John F. "Bunny" Ahearne, who presented the Trophy that has been contested each season since 1952. Bunny Ahearne is the elder statesman of European ice hockey and next week travels to Helsinki for the Group A matches in the 1974 World Championship. He goes as President of the International Ice Hockey Federation and President of the British Ice Hockey Association.

Mr. Ahearne has made it clear that he is in favour of a European Club League and will advocate such a League during the important

meetings that will take place during the Championships. We sincerely hope that notice is taken of a man who has done much to enhance European ice hockey in the world scene.

FAMOUS NAMES AT WEMBLEY

Last Sunday the former England soccer captain Bobby Moore brought a party along to the Lions-Helsinki match. It was his son Dean's sixth birthday and Lions have a new-found fan. Bobby used to watch ice hockey at Haringay.

Lord Thomson of Fleet will be with us on Thursday—Lord Thomson has yet to miss a week—and he'll be joined by Eric Morecambe and his wife. Eric, in case you didn't know, is a Director of Luton Town F.C., and a keen sports fan. Another soccer man with us on Thursday—Gordon Jago, Manager of Queen's Park Rangers. His wife, June, was a Streatham Supporter in British League days. On Sunday Arsenal goalkeeper, Bob Wilson, with his wife Meg and their family, join us once again. Bob will present the Koho Award after the Lions last match, to the player with the highest aggregate number of stars awarded by the Press during the Spring series.

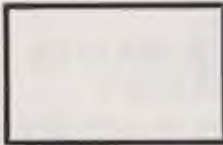
The tournament, by the way, was won by the Czechs who beat Spartak 4—3 in the third match.
